RABBI'S MESSAGE

Shalom & Blessings of Peace

March into Spring with Joy, Liberation, and Global Impact!

As the vibrancy of spring has not yet begun to awaken around us—covered in snow as we are—our Jewish calendar points towards two incredible holidays, offering us moments of deep joy, reflection, and communal celebration. I am inclined to believe that the flowers will bud this spring just like they have in previous years.

This March 2026, both Adar II and Nisan, the one and only, land in that Gregorian month. We live in two cultures with two calendars; we discuss Torah and the prospects of the Seahawks. Even though I lived in New England for 26 years, I understand now for the first time that since I was a Jets fan in my youth, it was upon me to root for the Seahawks. Go Seahawks! Time for a confession: I was watching Homeland during the Super Bowl.

Our Joyous Purim Celebration

We look forward to our joyous, topsy-turvy Purim celebration! Indeed, on the evening of Monday, March 2nd (the 14th of Adar II), we will gather for our communal Purim Se'udah, read the Megillah, delight in hamantaschen, and fill our sanctuary with hooting and hollering as we recall how we were saved from annihilation at the hands of antisemitic tyrants. That's always fun! If we don't laugh, we'll cry—and since we don't want to cry, we laugh!

Purim festivities will continue through Tuesday, March 3rd (and until March 4th in Jerusalem, Israel and Shushan, located in the modern-day city of Susa, or Shush, as the locals call it).

Why Two Days of Purim?

You might wonder why Purim is sometimes observed on two different days. The Megillah teaches us that while Jews in unwalled cities celebrated their salvation on the 14th of Adar, those in the walled capital city of Shushan celebrated on the 15th. This tradition extends to this day: cities that were walled from the time of Joshua, like Jerusalem, observe Purim on the 15th, known as Shushan Purim.

I recall, as a yeshiva student in Israel, observing Purim on the 14th in Ma'alot Dafne and then accepting an invitation for Shushan Purim in the Rova Yehudi (the Jewish Quarter of Jerusalem) on the 15th. It was at the apartment of a Mekubal (Kabbalist), Rabbi Sheinberger, who made a great effort to provide English translations of Kabbalistic works by the Baal HaSulam—Yehuda Ashlag (1885–1954) or Yehuda Leib Ha-Levi Ashlag (Hebrew: — לֵב הַלֵּוִי אֲשֶׁלַג) to impressionable youth such as myself back in the early 1980s. I still have those books, and only now, after many years, am I revisiting them through the lens of an additional forty years of learning and life experience.

A Special Birthday and Passover Preparation

This year, a very special personal milestone coincides with our preparations: my birthday falls on Tuesday, March 31st, which is also the day of Bedikat Chametz—the ceremonial search for leaven in our homes that evening. And no fooling, the First Seder will be held on the evening of Wednesday, April 1st, followed by the Second Seder on the evening of Thursday, April 2nd. We are excited to gather again as a community for our communal Seder on the second night of Passover.

We Are the Leaven in the Bread

This brings about a final thought for now: We, the Jewish people, comprise approximately 0.2% of the world's population. It's a tiny percentage. Yet, when we consider a trace amount of leaven having the power to cause the entire dough to rise, we realize we too are like the leaven in the bread.

Leaven is a living enzyme, dynamic and transformative. Yeast is a single-celled microbe classified within the Kingdom Fungi. The most well-known species, *Saccharomyces cerevisiae*, has been utilized by humans for thousands of years in the production of bread, beer, and wine. Yeast is a complex biological entity that exhibits all the characteristics necessary to be scientifically defined as alive.

We too have all the characteristics of being considered scientifically and spiritually alive. Our ideas are vibrant; our culture is profoundly life-affirming. We are small, but our impact on every field of human endeavor is undeniably massive. It's not our numbers but the liveliness of our essence that matters the most!

How fortunate are we, and how pleasant our heritage!

Temple Emanu-El 5786-2026 Mechirat Hametz Form

Passover (Pesach), commemorates the story of the Exodus, and the Israelites' freedom from slavery in Egypt. Passover begins on the 15th day of the month of Nisan in the Jewish calendar and is celebrated for eight days.

The children of Israel are forbidden to own any type of hametz,(leaven) during Pesach from Wednesday, evening, April 1,2026 until sunset of Thursday, April 9, 2026. The form below authorizes Temple Emanu-El's Shaul Praver to act as an **agent** for the sale of hametz to a non-Jew. The hametz is stored away until after the Pesach holiday.
