PRESIDENTS' MESSAGE

Haazinu"my rock and my redeemer "(צור, י וְגֹ אֶל ִי)

In *Parashat Haazinu*, what do G-d and a large rock formation have in common? In v. 4, "the Rock" appears in conjunction with descriptions of G-d as "steadfast...true and upright." These words highlight the solid, seemingly immovable aspect of a rock, which the poet compares to G-d's unwavering loyalty and righteousness. Yet, rocks have many other features, and the poet picks up on different associated commonplaces as the metaphor appears later in the poem.

For instance, v. 15 returns to the metaphor of G-d as rock, recounting how Israel spurned "the Rock of his rescue." This verse makes reference to the way a large rock can provide protection, a characteristic frequently invoked by the many manifestations of this metaphor in the Psalms, as in the depictions of G-d as "my rock and my redeemer "(צוֹלֵי וְלַאֵלֵי) (Psalm 19:15) or "my strength...my fortress, my rescuer, my G-d, my rock in whom I seek refuge" (Psalm 18:2-3). This military meaning of the metaphor of G-d as rock in v. 15 contrasts with its meaning in v. 4, where the analogy implies divine loyalty and righteousness in a broad, non-military context.

The word אור (rock) appears many times in our Torah and also in the siddur. If you think about its meaning, which is a firm foundation or support, you can see a picture of something positive that can support you when you need it. Usually the word refers to G-d.

As we approach the high holy days, let's look to G-d for support, as we embark on our journey. One of the ways in which G-d can help us is to visit our synagogue and share this with others. Yes, G-d is everywhere and you can have a relationship anywhere. This year, why not come to Temple Emanu-El and we can share our rock with each other. Maybe you can bring your friends so we can begin to grow and flourish

RABBI'S MESSAGE

Shalom And Blessings of Peace

Rosh Hashanah marks the head of the new year—the start, the beginning. The head is the central command center of the body where the brain resides. The brain is the place that generates thoughts, which are the fruits of the mind. Rosh Hashanah is the quintessential holiday on the Jewish calendar.

I recall a time when the first heart transplants were performed. Our superstitious minds believed that the recipient would take on the emotions of the donor. However, this turned out not to be the case. Why not? Emotions are not caused by the physical heart or the brain; they come from a spiritual source. For every blade of grass that grows in the field, there is a spiritual entity (Angel) that commands it into existence. The Zohar mentions that every aspect of creation, including the smallest elements of nature, is influenced by spiritual forces. This reflects the belief that all physical entities have a corresponding spiritual reality that sustains and commands them. This idea is similarly expressed by Plato in his theory of the World of Forms. According to Plato, the physical world is merely a shadow or imitation of this higher reality. For instance, while we may encounter various instances of beauty, they are all imperfect representations of the ideal Form of Beauty.

As such, our feelings may flow through the heart but are not caused by it. In the case of a heart transplant, the recipient is gifted with a healthier heart pump enabling them to continue living in their body. Their emotions originate from a spiritual source, the original progenitor of their life, not the shadow. The angel is not the blade of grass; rather, the angel is a force that commands the shadow of this blade of grass to grow and exist. We might think of it as a sort of spiritual DNA that defines what shall be built or manifested.

What do you suppose would happen if it were possible to perform a brain transplant? Would the recipient inherit the thoughts of the donor? I think not. The thoughts are not tightly bound to the physical brain in the way we might assume with our superstitious minds. The physical brain engages with spiritual pursuits called thought because these thoughts already exist in the universe and are generated through a creature called a person via the brain. "I think, therefore I am." (Descartes)

To illustrate this by analogy, electricity comes from many sources, one of which is lightning and electromagnetic fields in the atmosphere. We have learned to harness a fraction of that energy and utilize it in our technology.

Rosh Hashanah represents the restarting of the original thought that consciousness precedes our physical brain and flows through it, transcending it. All of this leads us to the singular source of consciousness itself. This is why the introspection and contemplative activities we engage in during Rosh Hashanah are life-giving. They renew our lives and reconnect us with the origins of ourselves in the place we call our soul—Neshama. The source of our individual souls is a universal heart and a universal mind that points to the universal source of consciousness, which is G-d. Our ancestors referred to this as Avinu, Malkenu—Our Father, Our King, Our Savior, and Our Redeemer. This is the spiritual concept central to Judaism.

No matter how many neural connections and circuits one builds into a robot, it will never truly feel or experience consciousness. It will never truly laugh, love, or desire like human beings do because there is something called a soul, which is part of the transcendent creative force we call G-d. Han'shama Lach Ve'haguf Shelach—G-d, the soul and the body are Yours. Through Teshuva (introspection that seeks to unify with the optimal way of being), Tephillah (prayer that focuses our minds and hearts on this noble project), and Tzedakah (charity that puts these thoughts into action with tangible impact), we secure for ourselves, our loved ones, and the whole house of Israel our place Be'Sefer Chayim, in The book of Life. Shana Tova Umetuka— A Good and Sweet New Year!
