On Friday, March 7, 2025, the synagogue celebrated SHABBAT ACROSS AMERICA AND CANADA. This Shabbat dinner event asks our congregants to sit together pray, and have a special meal together. Michelle Levine, a Jewish advocate, shared with the participants her way of helping Israeli soldiers to withstand the situation in Gaza. She told us about gathering basic materials and delivering them personally. She was inspirational and interesting.

Purim, which is a holiday commemorating the Jewish people's freedom from the oppression of Haman from the ancient Persian Empire, took place on Friday, March 13, 2025. It is customary to read a special book called "Megillat Purim." As the Megillah is read, the mention of the evil Haman is drowned out by noise and commotion. Another tradition is to share some Hammentaschen with others.

On Sunday, April 13, 2025, the temple will host a second seder. The fee for the meal will be take from the Jerome Rose bequest. The participants will be asked to donate \$25.00 for supplies to the Israeli soldiers.

Schmooze a little, eat a little, learn a lot is another program that was started by Iris and Irwin Rothblatt. Many of our members presented topics on Jewish photography, Angels in Judaism, Barbara Streisand, Opera and Jews, Jews and Jazz, etc. This is a wonderful activity and we hope to continue it.

Although our temple is situated in a smaller space, it is active and is busy with Shabbat services as well as other activities.

May this year bring us new members and may they recreate the large congregation of the past.

RABBI'S MESSAGE

Shalom and Blessings of Peace,

As we approach the holiday of Passover, we are reminded of the beauty and wonder of nature. The full moon, which coincides with the start of Passover, symbolizes the reflection of G-d's light in our lives. Just as the full moon reflects the sun's light optimally, we are called to reflect G-d's light optimally, each of us in our own unique way.

In the words of Shir Hashirim (Song of Songs), "The voice of the turtle dove is heard again in our land" (2:12). This verse reminds us of the renewal and rebirth that comes with Passover, as we celebrate our freedom from slavery and our connection to the natural world. We open all our senses to the warming and awakening of spring and its manifold blessings.

We look forward to gathering together as a community for our second-night Passover seder. It's always a joyous and meaningful evening, filled with delicious food, beautiful decor, and wonderful company. We're grateful to Varda and Irene for their hard work in arranging the details, which always make the evening so special.

Passover is also a time to reflect on the values that are at the heart of our community. Our educational program, on display during the reading of the Haggadah, is designed to encourage curiosity and creativity, while also passing on our traditions and values to the next generation. The Haggadah's Socratic-style dialogue, which encourages the youth to "ask your father or mother, and they will elucidate life for you" (Exodus 12:26), reminds us of the importance of intergenerational transmission of knowledge and wisdom. We, the elders, who are like wine that increases in value with age, are yoked with the task of transmitting our knowledge to others.

As we gather around the seder table, we are reminded of the values of humility and simplicity. The matzah, or "poor person's bread," is a symbol of our ability to be happy with little and to accept abundance in our lives in a balanced manner. We recall the bitter times but keep our hearts open for the sweet and precious times too.

Passover Emanu-El 5785-2025 Mechirat Hametz Form - The Sale of Hametz Leaven

Pesach commemorates the story of the Exodus, and the Israelites' freedom from slavery in Egypt. Passover begins on the 15th day of the month of Nisan in the Jewish calendar and is celebrated for eight days.

The children of Israel are forbidden to own any type of hametz,(leaven) during Pesach from Saturday, April 12, until sunset of Sunday, April 20, 2025. The form below authorizes Temple Emanu-El's Rabbi Shaul Praver to act as an agent for the sale of hametz to a non-Jew. The hametz is stored away until after the Pesach holiday.
